It's incredible watching it all come together, knowing that with each nail and screw we are one step closer to completing our crucial facility renovations at Teton Youth & Family Services.

Currently, construction is right on track at Red Top Meadows, the third and final facility update as part of our Building Brighter Futures campaign. The foundation has been poured, structural beams are in place, and we hope to have the exterior walls complete in December.

The Red Top residents have been so patient throughout this process, and they couldn't be more excited about what's to come. Our brand new indoor recreation space will hold an indoor gym, a basketball hoop, pickleball court, and even a rock climbing wall. The boys will enjoy greater autonomy with individual bedrooms and shared access to bathrooms, and all of the residents' gear will be easier to access and put away with new storage spaces below the bedroom area.

But it's something we work on at Red Top Meadows, learning to cope and adapt in healthy ways, and finding positive solutions to life's challenges. Learning to embrace change, not fight it, helps us learn and grow, and sometimes we realize it's all for the better.


Our RTM residents and staff have truly been feeling the ups and downs of change as we experience the adventure of living at RTM during our facility renovations this year.

For the employees, strategic supervision has been harder to maintain, as all the spaces are being used differently during this flux period, and staffing has been more challenging. Even in light of this, there have been no safety concerns or issues for the boys – they have

done a fantastic job of being respectful and keeping their distance from both the workers and construction space.

When RTM was first demolished roughly a year ago, the residents moved into temporary housing. To our surprise, they were much more comfortable in this temporary space, realizing just how cramped they had felt in the old Red Top Meadows facility. This makes us even more excited for the new individual bedrooms the boys will experience when the facility renovations are complete!

All in all, we are making the best of it here at Red Top Meadows, finding the joy in the challenge, and learning and adjusting alongside our young residents. It's a growing experience for us all, and the future is looking bright because of it.



Fall Wildy Project: MUDDY & MOTIVATED

Each fall, our Red Top Meadows residents take to the woods to complete the yearly Wildy Project: trail work and maintenance in the National Forest around Wilson and Jackson Hole. This year, a local horse-packing outfitter mentioned that there were some very muddy and washed out sections of trail accessed from the North Fork Road - an area that Red Top Meadows has worked to maintain for the last 20 years.

The project involved working with the Forest Service to "bench out" the section of trail, building it up in such a way so that water can drain. All of the boys were engaged, active, and inspired on this project, making short work of the trail updates in only a day and a half, and spending two nights camping in the National Forest.

The trail is now passable by horse once again – and built more sustainably as well – because of our residents' hard work. "It's amazing to see these young men take responsibility and ownership of their Fall Wildy Project, working together to make a difference in their community. You can see the pride on their faces when it's completed." states Teddy Nichols, TYFS' Wilderness Program Manager.

And this year's project was made all the more special, as one of the local horse-packers reached out to thank our residents for their hard work and offered to take the boys on a pack trip at some point in future summers.

Empowered Minds:

ACADEMIC DAY TREATMENT PROGRAM


THE PILOT PROGRAM FOR **OUR ACADEMIC SUPPORT DAY** TREATMENT, EMPOWERED MINDS, RAN FROM FEBRUARY TO JUNE OF 2024, AND IT WAS **AN INSPIRING SUCCESS!**

Empowered Minds provides academic support to students in a therapeutic setting while developing life skills through enrichment, experiential learning, job experience, and community service. The program serves middle and high school students with the highest need based on dropout risk, truancy rates, and credit deficiencies; as well as homeschooled students needing academic and social support, or students facing suspension and expulsion.

Empowered Minds lives under the umbrella of the Van Vleck House, as it operates in a large Flex Space environment: it is used as a classroom for half of the day, and then as a shared group space where activities and therapy groups are hosted.

The program began with part-time teachers from Teton Tutors, but as we have seen its success over the past year and realized there was a critical need for this kind of program in the community, we have since hired a fulltime teacher. We are so thrilled to have Austen Coviello as our Empowered Minds Coordinator!

This summer was the busiest yet, and we were still able to take on additional

The quote "if you build it, they will come" rang true for us at Van Vleck House this summer — this was the busiest summer on record for our Group Home and Crisis Shelter, and typically, the warmer months are quieter. However, this year was incredibly busy! With our increased staff and therapeutic space made possible by our Building Brighter Futures facility updates, we saw more kids in crisis getting the attention and support they so desperately need. This rise in demand for TYFS' services means that our community is doing a better job of recognizing those in need and providing timely assistance. Each young person who is able to find stability contributes to a stronger, more resilient community. This summer has reinforced the importance of a solid support system for our youth — that the vital services we provide through TYFS bring hope and positive change to the greater Wyoming community.



SOMETHING NEW FROM THE HIRSCHFIELD CENTER...

Sometimes, we feel that the only people who can truly understand what we are going through are those who have gone through the same thing. It creates a bond, a connection, that tightens the trust and communication, and can often lead to healing from both parties. That's the mindset of the new after-school program in partnership with Hirschfield Center Therapists and the TYFS Court Diversion Officer: youth in our Court Diversion Program now have Peer Groups where they have support within their own age, that isn't just adults, therapists, and teachers. It's a fantastic opportunity for kids to learn they are not alone and take ownership of themselves and their path, and a unique way these young people can give back to their community. We can't wait to see how this inspiring new program unfolds throughout the coming year!
